	industry using A3 or flip chart paper. They will come back to this at the end of the lesson.		
	1. The first 5 minutes each student will be given a fact sheet about one of the		
	following careers in insurance: insurance broker, insurance underwriter, actuary		
	and claims adjuster. Each student will spend this time understanding the role, the

Become an	2. The following 5 mins, the student will find another student with a different role and	mins
